Dear Friends,

This year marked a remarkable milestone - the **10th Anniversary** of our farm-based education programs. Since 2013, City Farm SLO has been tasked with managing 19 acres of the Calle Joaquin Agricultural Reserve in sustainable agricultural production and community education. For the past 10 years, we have done that and so much more.

Over the years, we've engaged more than **9,000 youth** in robust education programs, welcomed over **7,500 community members** for on-farm experiences, and supported small-scale growers in sustainable and regenerative practices. Each year, our programs have grown to welcome an ever increasing number of youth. In 2024, our Youth Empowerment Program received a record number of applications, and thanks to a generous donor we expanded the cohort to welcome all applicants. During the 2023-2024 school year, more than 900 k-5th graders visited City Farm for Farm Field Trips. Thanks to our supporters, fee waivers are offered to schools that need it, ensuring that every student can visit the farm to explore where their food comes from. In the last year, our staff, students, volunteers, and interns have scaled our regenerative farming operations to grow and distribute a record amount of wholesome produce. Our growing programs are moving the needle on community health outcomes and contributing to a resilient local food system!

In the next year, we plan to impact more youth than ever before. Equipped now with full funding, we will build our long-anticipated **Wash & Pack Facility**- a critical new space which will allow us to expand our farming and education programs.

We have ambitious goals, and none of this work would be possible without your generous support. I'd like to extend heartfelt appreciation to our dedicated staff, volunteers, donors, and partners.

Together, we are growing the next generation of agricultural leaders!

EMPOWERING YOUTH

2,295 Students were enrolled in education programs

YOUTH EDUCATION PROGRAMS



City Farm SLO's **Youth Empowerment Program (YEP)** provides career and college readiness workshops and technical instruction to underserved youth in SLO County through intensive summer workshops and internships.

To date, 133 teens have graduated from YEP and 8 graduates have served as Leadership Interns. As a result of programming:

- 100% of graduates are more prepared for employment opportunities
- 94% of graduates reported that they are better equipped to make healthy choices
- 100% of graduates report an improvement in their mental health

City Farm SLO's **Therapeutic Horticulture Program** helps students with disabilities build critical life skills through farm-based activities.

City Farm SLO's **Farm Field Trips** connect students with food and where it comes from. Students experience the farm as a living classroom, investigating concepts in plant science, soils, nutrition, and food literacy. In 2023-2024, 916 students visited City Farm for field trips, and an additional 1,170 students participated in **Virtual Field Trips**.

14,326

We use regenerative farming techniques that improve soil health, sequester carbon, enhance biodiversity, and promote environmental and community well-being.

Our farming practices include:

- No-till & reduced till
- Cover cropping
- Rotational cropping
- Compost applications
- Integrated pest management
- Livestock integration



TENANT FARMING PROGRAM

City Farm SLO provides affordable land leases and supportive services for small-scale farmers on the Central Coast.

With funding from a USDA Grant, we have expanded services via the City Farm Collaborative which provides training, technical assistance, and marketing services for our tenant farmers. The City Farm Collaborative makes twice-weekly sales to San Luis Ranch Marketplace (delivered in our electric farm vehicle!) and other local restaurants.

Since 2022, City Farm SLO has partnered with the *AmeriCorps Californians For All College Fellowship Program*. Each year, approximately 20 Cal Poly Fellows are placed at City Farm SLO where they each complete 450 service hours. Fellows develop real-world, practical skills while supporting our mission by assisting with sustainable farming practices, leading K-12 educational programs, and contributing to food access initiatives for our local community. **In 2023-2024, our Fellows completed over 8,500 service hours at City Farm SLO.**

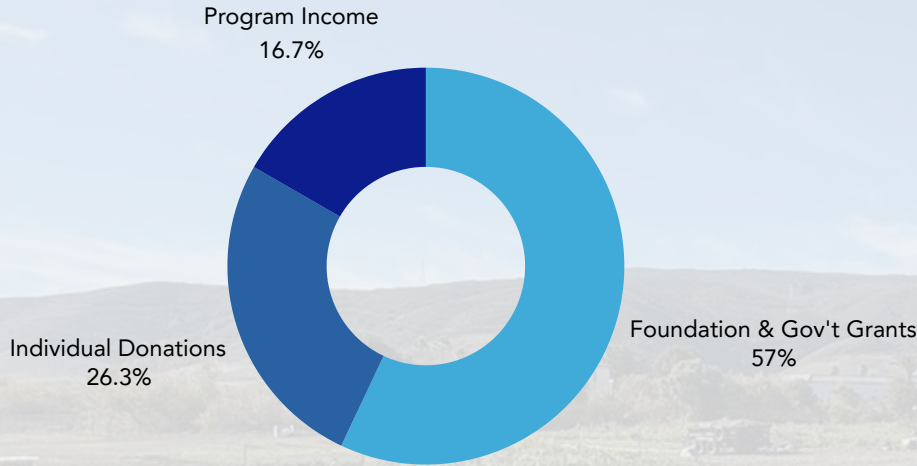

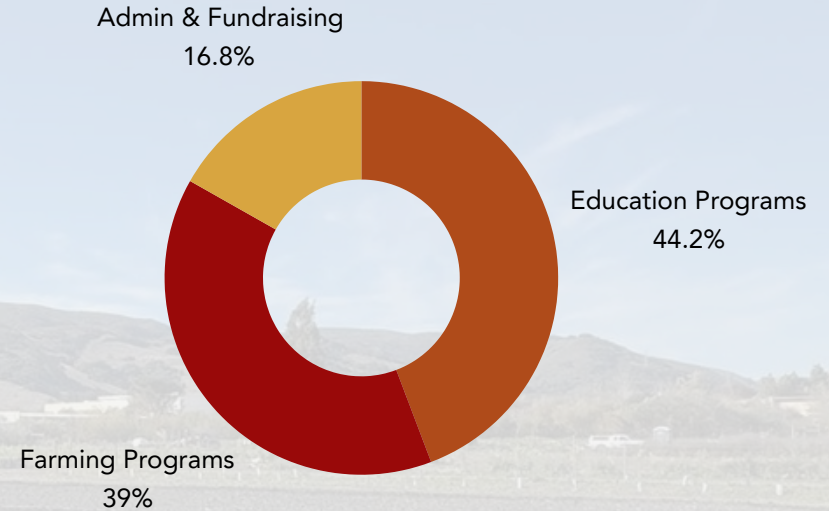


FINANCIAL GROWTH

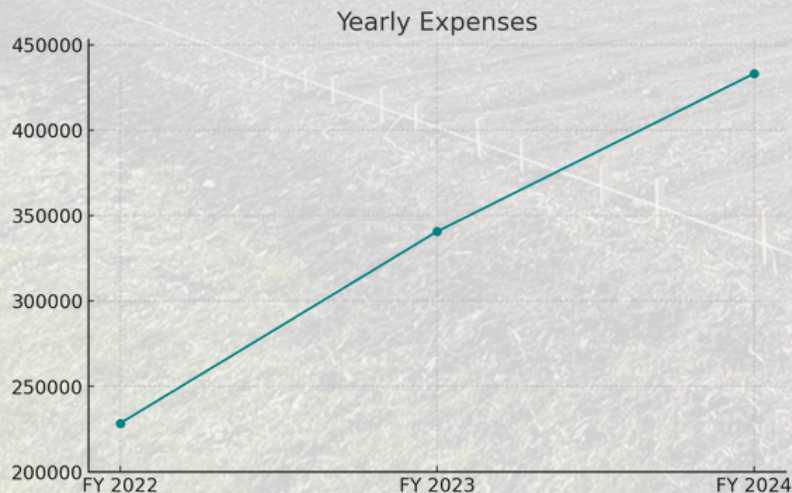
FY 2024 Revenue: \$453,450

Between FY 2022 and FY 2024, our budget increased by 90%

In that same time period, we increased our **number of instruction hours by 159%**, served **83% more students**, and grew **89% more food**.

In FY 2024, **83.2%** of our expenses were direct program costs.
